

After Midnight on July 20, Open Meat Goat entries will be accepted online only with a \$50.00 late fee per exhibitor until midnight on August 1st. No entries will be accepted after August 1st.

#### **ENTRY FEE**

- \$10 per animal for JABGA (Friday Evening Show)
- \$15 per animal for ABGA Show (Non-refundable \$7 pen cleaning fee included).

#### ANIMALS RELEASED

Exhibitors will be able to leave at the conclusion of the show on Saturday, all goats must be out of the barns by 3pm. (To allow time for pens to be cleaned and disinfected for the Open Dairy Goats).

## **RULES and REGULATIONS**

- 1. All exhibitors are subject to the general rules and livestock rules, in addition to the particular rules listed here.
- 2. The American Boer Goat Association (ABGA) sanction show rules shall govern. The ABGA will accept and permanently record all wins in shows that have been determined to have met all requirements for ABGA Sanction.
- 3. Any show receiving ABGA sanctioning shall be open to all exhibitors, however only two premiums are paid per exhibitor, per class. ABGA sanction cannot require animals to sell in a sale as a condition of participating in the show.
- 4. All goats must be registered in the herdbook of the ABGA. Original registration certificates are required, though a copy of Registration Application stamped with the date received by one of the listed Associations, can be accepted for kids less than 3 months of age.
- 5. All goats must have legible tattoos or other means of identification consistent with its registration certificate, or the animal will be disqualified. The top 2 in every class must be read and recorded. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the Exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.
- 6. Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used to determine the class divisions. August 9th will be used to determine JABGA and ABGA classes for both show days.
- 7. All animals must be registered purebred, fullblood or percentage blood Boer Goats. Progeny of fresh does will not be allowed in the ring. At the discretion of the judge and the superintendent, goats may be let loose in the ring as a function of judging.
- 8. Any goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from the show in any breeding classes. Artificial coloring will be a disqualification as well as illegible tattoos or tattoos that are inconsistent with the goats registration papers. Any doe over 24 months of age that has not kidded and cannot prove a current pregnancy will not be allowed in the ring. Horns are acceptable.
- Exhibitors must provide own feed and hay. Note: Storage is very limited and no more than one tack area will be planned for any area. Please provide your own storage. All aisles must remain accessible for fair patrons.
- 10. Each exhibitor will receive one 3 day pass for 1-5 animals entered, two 3 day passes for 6-10 animals, and three 3 day passes for 11 or more animals. The Superintendent is the only person in this department with passes. Any other passes needed must be purchased at the Fair Office for the amount indicated for the type of pass.
- 11. Exhibitors must bring official health papers. All animals being exhibited must be included on health papers. All animals will be inspected by the MDA inspector or the superintendent on the trailer before they can be unloaded.
- 12. All livestock trailers must be parked in designated areas only, assigned at check-in.
